What is RAD?

The Rainbow Alliance of the Deaf (RAD) is a nonprofit organization established in 1977. RAD has traditionally functioned as a social organization that has provided the Lesbian, Gay, Bisexual, and Transgender Community (LGBT) members of the deaf and hard of hearing community with a safe place to meet, share information, and feel empowered. As the organization continues to grow and mature, the RAD focus has shifted more towards education and advocacy.

The deaf and hard of hearing community of today is much more educated and open-minded than that of the past. In the past, many deaf and hard of hearing people believed that gay people caused HIV/AIDS. That of course, was not true. As the Deaf LGBT becomes more visible, people are becoming more aware that Deaf LGBT people are really no different from other Deaf people. We are all diverse, just as the deaf and hard of hearing community is diverse. The only difference is our sexual orientation.

RAD assists individuals and organizations with their issues and/or concerns by providing information and referrals. They also support LGBT members by providing a "safe place" support and empowerment, education about health issues and homophobia, and advocacy for access at hearing LGBT events/conferences and LGBT rights.
